# Message from the CCCB

## 75 years of episcopal collegiality and solidarity with the People of God in Canada

I would like to take the opportunity, in the context of the annual *Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada* (29-30 September 2018) to highlight the 75th anniversary of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB). The CCCB was established in 1943 under the name *Canadian Catholic Conference*; it was recognized by the Holy See in 1948 and, following the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), became part of the worldwide network of episcopal conferences.

Concerned with meeting the needs and challenges of the Church in Canada and of Canadian society, the Catholic Bishops (who were already meeting together regularly over a number of years) wished to find a forum to better promote the gifts and benefits that the Church could offer, by using means appropriate to the circumstances of time and place. Pastoral, liturgical, religious, and socio-political questions were at the heart of the life of the Church and of families of the time, as Canada was engaged in the Second World War. How could one go about bearing witness to the Gospel message of hope in the midst of the preoccupations of the day?

Through their Episcopal Conference, the Catholic Bishops continue to work in the areas of evangelization and pastoral care: the transmission of Christian faith, doctrinal and ethical questions, ecumenical initiatives, interreligious dialogue, international relations, faith education and catechesis, relations with Indigenous peoples, questions of social justice, and the development of a culture of life and family. The Conference allows the Bishops to promote their *collegiality* and to facilitate the coordination of *common initiatives* of nationwide importance. Ultimately, the Conference exists in order to help Bishops in their ministry for the good of the People of God. As Pastors of the Church in Canada, Bishops are also enabled in their *honest and coherent dialogue with the nation's political authorities*.

The *Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada* gives the country's Catholics the opportunity to be in solidarity with their diocese or eparchy, while allowing them to participate in the work of their regional episcopal assembly and the mission of the national Episcopal Conference.

Thank you in advance for your generous contribution and for being in solidarity with our Episcopal Conference.

Following the encouragement of Pope Pius XII, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) was established in 1943 under the name Canadian Catholic Conference; it was officially recognized by the Holy See in 1948 and, following the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), became part of the worldwide network of episcopal conferences. As the CCCB President states in his message for the Collection, "Through their Episcopal Conference, the Bishops today continue to work together on doctrinal and ethical questions; ecumenical initiatives and interreligious dialogue; international relations; evangelization, faith education and catechesis; relations with Indigenous peoples; questions of social justice, and the development of a culture of life and family.." In addition to their national Conference, the Bishops of Canada also meet in four Regional Assemblies (Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario and the West). The CCCB as well as the regional assemblies include the Bishops of the Latin Church in Canada together with the Eparchial Bishops of the Eastern Catholic Churches.
